

Crime Reporting Tips – How To Be a Good Witness:

- If you see something – Say Something.
- Stay on the phone with 911 till the operator tells you to hang up.
- Do not play “cop” or stop suspects from leaving.
- Each witness should independently complete their own suspect description form.
- Document what you see, hear & do.
- Get a good description of the people, vehicle & direction of travel.
- Give a statement to the police.
- Be polite & helpful to police and witnesses.
- Prepare to provide pictures & video evidence.
- Be willing to testify.
- Report facts, not conclusions.
- What to include in your statement:
 - Who: list and describe all individuals involved.
 - What: describe the incident and circumstances in detail.
 - Where: specify the location as accurately as possible.
 - When: pay attention to the specific time and the passage of time.
 - How: describe the behavior of all involved.
 - Names of witnesses: include contact information if possible.
