With almost 950 graduates, Leadership Stockton is a proven, award-winning program of the Greater Stockton Chamber of Commerce. Congratulations for taking the first step (the application) to update your thinking on serving our community. Historically, your class members become a second family which you can always call on in your future endeavors.

Here is how to become part of Leadership Stockton:

- Complete the application on paper or online. www.stocktonchamber.org or www.
- Your application includes a page to be completed by your employer (if you are not self-employed).
- Paper applications must be submitted to the Greater Stockton Chamber of Commerce by Friday,
 June 9, 2023, at 12:00 PM. 445 W Weber Avenue, Suite 220, Stockton, CA 95203
- Next an interview will be scheduled. All applicants will be interviewed by a panel of Leadership Stockton alumni. Interviews are usually in late June or early July.
- You will hear in mid to late July if you will be selected for the Class of 2024. The first session will be in August.
- If you are not selected, please apply again next year. With only 30 students accepted each year, the selection process is difficult. The interview panels are seeking to make a diverse class that is interested in making Stockton a great place to live, work, and play.

Before you apply, make sure that this is the year for you! Here is more about what to expect:

- Leadership Stockton meets for eleven months. Dates are on the application. There are three mandatory sessions. You may only have one full day absence OR two-partial days. It is important for you to attend all the sessions to fully gain what the program has to offer. Classes are from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM. Lunch is provided, and class members are expected to stay through lunch.
- In addition to the class sessions, class members will be participating in a group project. The class decides on what the project is by determining what the group thinks needs to be improved. The class raises the funds to complete the project. Class members will need to meet outside of class to make the project happen. The completed project is an accomplishment that no one forgets.



- Class members are also asked to complete individual projects. These projects are the class member's
 choice and will provide the opportunity to go on a ride-a-long, attend a board meeting, donate blood,
 and much more.
- Professional dress is required for most sessions. Some sessions may be casual depending on the activities.
- Each month focuses on a specific area of what is important in leadership. Check the application to make sure you will make the dates in the year you are applying.

Tuition for the Class of 2024 will be \$2,000. It is suggested that \$200 be paid by the class members themselves. The remainder of the tuition may be paid by an employer, service club, organization, or the class member. The first \$200 must be paid before orientation. The remaining balance must be paid by December 31, 2023. The Leadership Stockton Alumni Association does offer a partial scholarship. The amount is determined by how many class members request a scholarship. Arrangements for a payment plan must be made prior to class starting.

Tuition

The tuition fee is \$2,000 per class member. Each class member is required to pay the first \$200 of the tuition fee. The remainder of the tuition may be paid by any club, organization, business, employer, or class member. No monies will be collected until notification of acceptance. All tuition is due by December 31, 2023. Payments may be made if arranged with the Program Director prior to the orientation session. Financial assistance may be available through the Leadership Stockton Alumni Association. You are encouraged to seek sponsor(s) if your employer is not paying the tuition as partial scholarship funds are limited. If accepted the Leadership Stockton Program Director will contact you regarding tuition.
